

**NURSING AGREEMENTS BETWEEN
NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL UNIVERSITY
AND HALIFAX COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

North Carolina Central University (NCCU) welcomes qualified students the opportunity to transfer from Halifax Community College (HCC) for completion of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree at NCCU. Credit for college transfer courses completed at HCC will transfer to NCCU as detailed below.

**TRANSFERABILITY OF COURSE WORK COMPLETED
AT HALIFAX COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

Students who have completed the college transfer (AA or AS degree) or the 44 hour Core Curriculum approved under the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA):

Upon admission, NCCU's general education, or General Education Core (GEC) requirements are waived, except for one physical activities course (1-2 credits) and six semester hours of one modern foreign language. Students completing a physical activities course with a grade of C or better will have fulfilled NCCU's physical education requirement. Students completing Foreign Language I and II with a grade C or better at Halifax Community College will have fulfilled NCCU's general education Foreign Language I and II requirement. Halifax Community College students who have completed Foreign Language III as part of the 64-hour Associate degree will have fulfilled the NCCU Foreign Language III graduation requirement. Students who complete a technical degree program (e.g., A.A.S. or A.D.N.), or who do not complete a degree or the Core Curriculum approved under the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA) should adhere to the following guidelines:

Upon enrolling at NCCU, students in this category must satisfy all of NCCU's GEC requirements. The courses offered at Halifax Community College listed on the following page will transfer in fulfillment of NCCU's GEC requirements, as indicated, if the grade earned is C or better.

Students who do not complete an A.S./A.A./A.A.S. degree and who are under 24 years of age must meet the UNC System Minimum Admissions Requirements (MARs) from high school, or an approved alternative, to be admitted to NCCU (see Appendix A for additional information).

IMPORTANT ADDITIONAL NOTES

Students who meet all admission requirements will be admitted to NCCU on a space available basis.

Students who do not complete a college transfer degree and who are under 24 years of age must meet the UNC System Minimum Admission Requirements (MARs) from high school, or an approved alternate, to be admissible to NCCU (see Appendix A for additional information).

The maximum number of hours accepted from two year colleges is 64 semester hours. Students completing college transfer degree (AA or AS degrees) will transfer with 64 semester hours of credits. Students who earn other two year degrees, and students who do not earn degrees will have their classes evaluated on a course by course basis.

Appendix A

INFORMATION CONCERNING MINIMUM ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS TRANSFERRING TO NORTH CAROLINA CENTRAL UNIVERSITY

For students who graduated from high school after spring 1998, the following courses must be completed to meet the requirements for admission to North Carolina Central University. These are the Minimum Admissions Requirements (MARs) for all campuses in the University of North Carolina System; some campuses may have additional requirements. Note that some of these requirements may be waived for students who graduated from high school prior to the spring of 1988. Individual constituent institutions may require other courses in addition to the minimum requirements. For some transfer students and students who graduated from high school prior to 1990, special considerations have been made. Click on an institution for additional information specific to that institution.

Effective in Fall 2006:

- 4 course units of English emphasizing grammar, composition, and literature
- 4 course units of Math
 - Algebra I and II, Geometry, and one unit beyond Algebra II,
 - Algebra I and II, and two units beyond Algebra II,
 - Integrated Math I, II, and III, and one unit beyond integrated Math III.
- 1 course unit of U.S. History
- 2 course units in Social Studies course, including one unit in U.S. History, but an applicant who does not have the unit in U.S. history may be admitted on the condition that at least three semester hours in that subject will be passed by the end of the sophomore year.
- 3 course units of Science: one unit in a life or biological science, one unit in a physical science, and one unit in a natural science (either a life or biological science). At least one science course unit must have a laboratory component.

Minimum Course Requirements for students who graduated from high school in 1988 and 1989:

- 4 course units of English, emphasizing grammar, composition, and literature
- 2 course units of Math, including Algebra I and another math course. Note: Algebra IA and Algebra IB, and other configurations of Algebra I which have been broken into two parts, count as Algebra I only if both parts were completed successfully.
- 1 course unit of U. S. History
- 1 course unit of another Social Studies course

- 2 course units of Science: one unit in a life or biological science and one unit in physical science. At least one science course unit must have a laboratory component.

Students who did not meet the UNC System Minimum Admissions Requirements (MARs) while in high school must complete one of the two program tracks listed on the following page to be considered for transfer admission to North Carolina Central University. These program tracks cannot be completed at NCCU. Please note that other factors, such as grades and standardized test scores (SAT or ACT) may be used in the admission decision.

- 1.) Complete a college transfer (Associate in Arts (A. A. Degree), Associate in Science (A. S. Degree), or Associate in Fine Arts (A.F.A. Degree) at a two-year college. Please note that while certain courses in technical (Associate in Applied Science, or A. A. S.) degree program will transfer to NCCU, completion of such a program will in no way make a student eligible to attend the University if that student did not meet high school MARs. Therefore, if your ultimate goal is to transfer to NCCU and you plan to make up your course deficiencies at a two-year college, you must enroll in a college transfer program, rather than in a vocational or technical degree program.
- 2.) Complete 9 quarter hours (or 6 semester hours) of college transfer course work in each of four academic areas, for a total of 3 quarter hours (or 24 semester hours). Those areas are English, Mathematics, Social Studies and Science. Please note that developmental courses and courses in technical program tracks will not count toward the required hours to be considered for admission to NCCU; therefore, students must take transferable courses covered under the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA), if you plan to transfer to NCCU. In addition, you must earn grades of "C" or better, and you must maintain at least a 2.0 grade point average (on a 4.0 scale) at the institution or institutions from which you plan to transfer.

In certain instances, some of the high school requirements may be waived for a student who is at least 24 years of age. Please contact the Admissions Office for more details.

For students who have not completed the high school MARs, and who are less than 24 years of age, the course study outlines on the second page of this document includes all of the required English and Social Studies. Students who do not meet MARs and who choose to follow this outline must also complete one additional science course, and one additional Math course approved for transfer under the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement to be admissible to NCCU.
